I have quickly pasted the data into the attached spreadsheet so apologies for the presentation of it. I think this might be what you are looking for. I have noted the table numbers in there too in case you want to go back to source.

The only issue still is splitting out the bungalows from other detached properties so I think that the only way you will be able to find that is through a survey.

Perhaps this is a project some teenagers in the village could undertake – to go and survey how many bungalows there are? Or if there is a parish representative on each main street they could gather information just for their street?

This could be combined with a count of the total number of 'buildings', linked to below.

Listed buildings –

You can find the number of listed buildings in Stevington by counting them on our online map. On our home page, right hand side, online maps. You can click parish boundaries, listed buildings, and in fact anything else you are interested in (screen print below).
